REPORT OF THE MANAGER JULY 2021

I. <u>Water and Weather</u>

There were several heat waves throughout the month of July. The Delta Mosquito and Vector Control District (DMVCD) Weather Station reported an average high temperature of 102.0°F with an average low of 72.0°F and 0 inches of rainfall. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration 1981-2010 seasonal averages for high and low temperatures in July were 94.1°F and 66.7°F respectively, with average rainfall of 0.01 inches.

Water storage at Pine Flat Reservoir decreased to 214,255 acre-feet by the end of the month. By July 31, 2021, Pine Flat Reservoir's inflow had decreased to 467 cubic feet per second (CFS) and its release decreased dramatically to 1,328 CFS. The Lake Kaweah Reservoir ended the month with less water than the previous month, with 31,323 acre-feet on July 31, 2021. Lake Kaweah's inflow fluctuated dramatically at the end of the month, with the last reading being from July 29, 2021 showing 67 CFS and its release was decreased to 146 CFS.

II. <u>Narrative</u>

On July 2, 2021, the District purchased a right-hand side vehicle for the storm drain program. This equipment will allow a one-man operation to apply and inspect storm drains. In addition, this equipment will increase the efficiency of applications, and improve employee road safety while conducting inspections.

Continuous treatment of storm drain systems continued during the month of July throughout the Districts' jurisdiction. Approximately 10,502 storm drains were treated with a Methoprene product. Sites include street drains, parking lots, parks, apartment complexes, and schools. The District also began treating school storm drain with a long-term residual treatment and treated 36 active storm drains.

Larviciding aerial treatment for the Kaweah River Rock Plant Continued for the month of July, with the fourth treatment taking place on July 20, 2021. During the application, 8 acres were treated with an insect growth hormone regulator.

Due to high mosquito counts in the rural portion of the District, large BTI treatments have begun to reduce the mosquito populations near dense corn crops in the north region of Visalia.

On July 20, 2021, the Rural operation performed an ARGO (all-terrain vehicle) treatment covering 176-acre kiwi grove north of Dinuba treating multiple irrigation pockets.

Due to high viral activity, operations crew conducted an adult mosquito treatment on July 29, 2021. The treatment was conducted on the NW section of Visalia covering approximately 275 acres of land.

On July 26, 2021, Amanda Martin joined the urban operations team to assist with high trap counts specifically associated with *Aedes aegypti* sources.

High abundance of pasture mosquitoes north of Exeter on July 30, 2021 were decreased following an adult mosquito treatment.

The fish hatchery produced 1,223 fry in July. A total of 633 fish were distributed through 22 technician requests and 10 homeowner requests. So far, 2,813 fish have been placed in approximately 120 sources in 2021.

Routine mosquito surveillance continued throughout July. A total of 30,537 mosquitoes were collected across 1,140 trap nights. The District-wide average of 26.8 mosquitoes per trap night for the month of July is 1.3% lower than the previous 5-year average of 27.1, but 56.2% higher than the 2020 average of 17.2 mosquitoes per trap night. The top 3 mosquito species caught in July were *Culex quinquefasciatus* at 72.6%, followed by *Aedes aegypti* at 13.3% and *Culex tarsalis* at 5.4%.

Mosquito-borne disease testing for West Nile virus (WNV), St. Louis Encephalitis virus (SLEV), and Western Equine Encephalitis virus (WEEV) continued throughout July. The DMVCD tested 585 mosquito samples in July with 23 positives for WNV. Additionally, 2 dead bird carcasses were tested with 1 positive for WNV. The WNV positive mosquito samples were collected from Visalia, Farmersville, Dinuba, Peral, and west of Sequoia Fields. The WNV positive dead bird was collected from Visalia.

The Mosquito and Vector Control Association of California (MVCAC) conducted their quarterly conference over zoom on July 15, 2021, which was preceded by the Southern San Joaquin Regional Meeting, also over zoom, the previous Friday.

Interviews for the Community Education Outreach Coordinator took place near the end of the month, with an offer being made and accepted by Erick Arriaga to start in the position on August 16, 2021.

On July 28, 2021, the results from the balloting for the Prop 218 Assessment for funding additional *Aedes aegypti* activities passed with 57.03% weighted approval. The first funding from this assessment is not anticipated until December 2021 or January 2022.

Throughout July, employees who were not fully vaccinated continued to complete the online screening of COVID-19 survey and take paid time off to seek test results when required. The District will continue to be proactive in keeping employees and the public safe. Staff are encouraged to be fully vaccinated and allowed to take work time to do so.

III. <u>Vector and Disease Surveillance</u>

Delta MVCD Summaries

<u>Humans</u>: There were no human cases of an arbovirus reported by the local public health department for the month of July.

<u>Birds</u>: There were 2 dead birds reported to the District in July, with 1 testing positive for WNV. In 2021, a total of 5 dead birds were positive for WNV out of 11 dead birds tested.

<u>Mosquitoes</u>: There were 23 new WNV positive mosquito samples out of 585 tested in July. In 2021, a total of 46 mosquito samples were positive for WNV out of 1,048 tested.

State Surveillance:

Humans: A total of 4 human cases have been reported in 4 counties across the state.

<u>Birds</u>: As of July 30, 2021, 94 dead birds have tested positive for WNV. So far, 94 dead birds from 9 counties have tested positive for WNV out of 737 tested in 2021.

<u>Mosquitoes</u>: As of July 30, 2021, 563 mosquito samples were positive for WNV. A total of 18,071 mosquito samples were tested for WNV, SLEV, and WEEV with 563 samples from 20 counties positive for WNV in 2021

Weekly Update

Humans

Four human case of West Nile virus (WNV) illness were reported this week from Butte (2), Los Angeles (1), and Stanislaus (1) counties. **These are the first human WNV cases reported from Butte, Los Angeles, and Stanislaus counties this year.** In 2021, a total of eight WNV human cases have been reported from seven counties. Of the eight cases, three (38%) had neuroinvasive illness and one (13%) was fatal. The median age of the cases was 54 years, and five (63%) were male. Dates of symptom onset ranged from May 9 to July 21. In addition to the eight cases, two asymptomatic WNV infections have been reported from Kern (1) and San Bernardino (1) counties. At this time last year, five WNV cases had been reported from three counties.

Dead Birds

A total of 15 WNV positive dead birds were reported this week from 4 counties: Los Angeles (3), Nevada (1), Sacramento (10) and San Joaquin (1). In 2021, 109 WNV positive dead birds have been reported from 10 counties. **This is the first detection of WNV activity in Nevada County this year**. At this time last year, 64 WNV positive dead birds had been reported from 12 counties.

Mosquito Pools

West Nile virus

A total of 207 WNV positive mosquito pools were reported this week from 17 counties: Butte (11), Fresno (14), Kern (13), Lake (1), Los Angeles (25), Madera (16), Merced (1), Orange (2), Placer (10), Riverside (13), Sacramento (5), San Joaquin (47), Shasta (3), Solano (2), Stanislaus (26), Tulare (16), and Yolo (2). This is the first detection of WNV activity in Orange and Solano counties, and the first positive mosquito pools from Merced County this year. In 2021, 770 WNV positive mosquito pools have been reported from 23 counties. At this time last year, 474 WNV positive mosquito pools had been reported from 21 counties.

St. Louis encephalitis virus

Six mosquito pools from Fresno (1) and Riverside (5) counties were reported positive for St. Louis encephalitis virus (SLEV) this week. **This is the first detection of SLEV in Fresno and Riverside counties this year.** In 2021, nine SLEV positive mosquito pools have been reported from Fresno (1), Imperial (3), and Riverside (5) counties. At this time last year, 143 SLEV positive mosquito pools had been reported from 4 counties.

Sentinel Chickens

No WNV positive chickens were reported this week. In 2021, 10 WNV positive chickens have been reported from 3 counties. At this time last year, 12 WNV positive chickens had been reported from 3 counties.

TEST PROTOCOLS

Humans:

Specimens are tested by local laboratories with an IgM or IgG immunofluorescent assay (IFA) and/or an IgM enzyme immunoassay (EIA). Specimens with inconclusive results are forwarded to the California Department of Public Health Viral and Rickettsial Disease Laboratory (VRDL) for further testing with a plaque reduction neutralization test (PRNT).

Dead Birds

Oral swab samples collected from bird carcasses are tested at the UC Davis Arbovirus Research and Training laboratory (DART) or at a local agency for West Nile virus by RT-qPCR.

Sentinel Chickens:

Dried blood spot samples from sentinel chickens are tested at the California Department of Public Health Vector-Borne Disease Laboratory for IgG antibodies to West Nile, St. Louis encephalitis, and western equine encephalomyelitis viruses by an EIA. Positive samples are confirmed by IFA, western-blot, or PRNT.

Mosquito Pools:

Mosquito pools are tested at DART or at a local agency for West Nile, western equine encephalomyelitis, and St. Louis encephalitis viral RNA using a multiplex RT-qPCR. Invasive *Aedes* mosquitoes (*Ae. aegypti* and *Ae. albopictus*) are also tested at DART for chikungunya, dengue, and Zika viral RNA by a separate RT-qPCR.

2021/2022 BUDGET SUMMARY

The Budget Summary explains in detail the budgeted line items for fiscal year 2021/2022. Action will be taken at the August Board meeting to amend this Budget in accordance with the County Auditor's Final Report.

Wages

The Consumer Price Index, West Region data report for April reflected a 4.5% increase for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers over the last 12 months (See: Consumer Price Index, Page 7). The Budget has a 4.5% COLA increase for all full-time employees. (See: Salary Schedule, Page 8). By using the April data of the West Region Report, we will be using the same data as Tulare Mosquito Abatement District and Kings Mosquito Abatement District; the data will be more in line with the area and will keep staff near the top of the compensation schedule in all positions for the region. The budget also includes a 3% merit increase for the Administrative Assistant. Seasonal employees will have a minimum wage increase to \$15.00/hour effective January 1, 2022. Due to this minimum wage increase, the Certified Vector Control Technician I position will have an increase to \$17.60/hour.

Staffing: The Vector Control Technician I position will have 18 positions filled. The Vector Control Technician II position will add one employee in April 2022 to have 4 positions filled, for a total of 22 seasonal employees. The Vector Control Technician III/Mechanic position will have 2 positions filled. The Vector Control Technician III will have 1 position filled. The Biologist position will have 3 positions filled, and one vacancy. The budget reflects the anticipated hiring of a Community Education and Outreach Coordinator for a July 1, 2021 start date. All 8 remaining full-time positions will have one incumbent for a total of 15 full-time employees (See: Chain of Command, Page 9).

Budgeted Wages will increase by 1.67%, \$29,951.16; \$1,818,827.22 in 2021/22.

Benefits

Health Insurance premiums are budgeted for a 10% increase effective January 2022 through December 2022 at the PERS Choice funding level. This is a best guess because the normal preliminary numbers that are provided in May will not be available until June at the earliest this year. District budgeted expenses will increase by 6.00%, \$15,785.65; \$278,828.33.

LTD/STD/DENT/VSP/LTC premiums are collectively budgeted for a 5% increase effective January 2022 through December 2022; District budgeted expenses will increase by 0.28%, \$108.68; \$38,835.27.

Social Security will increase by 1.89% \$2,581.06; \$139,140.28 and *Unemployment* will increase by 4.65%, \$868.00; \$19,530.

CalPERS retirement premium will decrease by 9.65%, \$15,420.49; \$144,325.96 (14.54% Classic and 7.59% PEPRA of covered payroll)

CalPERS UAL will increase by 20.63%, \$27,362.00; \$160,017.00.

Workers Compensation will increase by 18.32%, \$13,063.00; \$84,383.00. Our X-Modification for the year is 0.976%.

OPEB Trust Fund will not have a contribution to the fund in 2021/22.

Benefits will increase by 5.4%, \$44,347.90; \$865,059.84 in 2021/22.

Services/Supplies

The services and supplies requiring funding increase/decrease for the 2021/22 fiscal year:

Please note that following advice from the auditors, capital items shall only be items costing \$1,000.00 or more. Therefore, some budget lines have a small increase for non-capital one-time purchases.

Chemicals will decrease by 0.74%, \$1,500.00; \$200,000.00 keeping with normal expenditure levels. (See: Chemical Purchases, Page 10).

Clothing will increase by 14.29%, \$1,000.00; \$8,000.00 due to increased seasonal staff.

Lab Supplies will increase by 57.14%, \$36,000.00; \$99,000.00 due to the addition of funding necessary for CDZ (Chikungunya, Dengue, Zika) testing of samples, pesticide resistance testing, and non-capital one-time purchases. (See: Lab Expenses, Page 11).

Fish Supplies will increase by 150.00%, \$3,000.00; \$5,000 to fund the operational expenses of the new fish hatchery (See: Fish Supplies, Page 12).

Janitorial Supplies will increase 62.50%, \$1,250.00; \$3,250.00 due to inclusion of cleaning supplies.

Building & Yard will increase by 323.08%, \$42,000.00; \$55,000.00 due in large part to necessary sewer line repairs in wash bay (\$32,000.00).

Auto Supply/Maintenance will decrease by 16.67%, \$4,000.00; \$20,000.00 keeping with normal expenditure levels.

Gasoline will increase by 24.00%, \$12,000.00; \$62,000.00 allowing for 12,739 gallons of unleaded at \$4.50 per/gallon and 1,057 gallons of diesel at \$4.50 per/gallon.

Utilities will increase by 36.17%, \$8,500.00; \$32,000.00 due to new fish hatchery energy consumption.

Liability will increase by 31.04%, \$18,452.24; \$77,899.00 as part of the JPA Equity Building 5year plan. There was a rate increase driven by the insurance market as well.

Office Supplies will increase by 151.75%, \$15,175.00; \$25,175.00 increasing to help new office personnel finish making necessary purchases and including non-capital one-time purchases such as new computers and printers (See: Office Supplies, Page 13).

Travel Expenses will decrease by 10.19%, \$3,471.50; \$30,601.50 (See: Travel Schedule, Page 14).

Dues will decrease by 1.27%, \$250.00; \$19,500.00 keeping with normal expenditure levels.

Subscriptions will increase by 65.62%, \$12,500.00; \$31,550.00 due to implementation of Field Seeker Data Collection.

Professional Services will increase by 284.13%, \$147,750.00; \$199,750.00 due to agreement with SCI to perform the Benefit Assessment.

Public Relations will decrease by 20.00%, \$10,000.00; \$40,000.00 keeping with normal expenditure levels.

Name, Logo & 100-Year Celebration \$20,000 is a new line item for charges necessary to implement the District name update as well as planning a 100-year celebration.

Total Services and Supplies will increase by 44.55%, \$328,450.74; \$1,065,645.50.
